Parents learned transferable workforce skills that make them an asset for any full-time roles in the future. Parents also set career goals, refined their resumes, and practiced interview skills, not to mention, our phones have been ringing off the hook with interested families because of their work.

In the classroom, our teachers and children have been hard at work. Our LENA program (Language Environment Analysis System) has been in full swing and our teachers are using the data from the program to increase each child's conversational turns. We are also thrilled that we are taking field trips for the first time since the pandemic began! In May our rising kindergarteners were able to visit an elementary school and experience the big cafeteria, a huge gym, and to be the little ones on campus! We also have had children go to Port Discovery in Baltimore and all had an awesome time!

While many think that the summer months bring a pause for educators, June through August is always incredibly busy at BBI. We are planning our annual Parent Empowerment Ceremony, our Pre-K graduation, and our staff Professional Development Week for School Year 2022-2023. 

#### 2-GEN IN ACTION

Our programming supports both children and their families. This creates a long-lasting impact and helps the family unit as a whole move from crisis to self-sufficiency.

### CHILDRENS MOBILE HEALTH

The Children's National mobile health unit was on site on Wednesday, June 1 to conduct physicals, screenings, and provide basic health services, including vaccinations, to our children. Twenty three children were seen by Dr. Hope-Rhodes, MD, who is following up with referrals for specialized treatment for six of the children. The mobile health unit comes to BBI two times each program year. Our partnership is a valuable asset to our two-generation approach to family health and wellness.



### FINANCIAL LITERACY

Bright Beginnings' Family Services department launched a 3-part financial literacy series in April with expertise provided by **Truist Bank**. The first session was titled, "Banking on Your Success" and was followed by sessions covering the importance of having a bank account, savings and budgets, and establishing and building up credit. The Truist representative, Ariana Flores, worked with parents one-on-one to assist with the topics covered. ### **PARENT INTERNS AT BBI**

BBI's workforce development program launched a new parent internship opportunity this spring! Five parents were trained and hired to serve as community canvassers. In this paid role, the parent interns work 10 hours a week over 3 days to spread awareness about BBI programs and services in Wards 7 and 8. In preparation for the job, the interns learned about BBI programs and services, reviewed ideal routes for recruitment, and role played conversations with potential enrollees. Our canvassers are seeing great success! They sold out BBI's Open House on May 24th and have helped recruit 5 potential homebased parents. This new skill set and engagement in BBI's workforce development program has allowed these parents to set SMART goals related to jobs and careers, update their resumes and portfolios, and expand their entrepreneurial skills.

## **DATA STORYTELLING**

Bright Beginnings records and evaluates each child's growth and development in order to plan activities that meet their individual needs. Assessment results are compared against our school readiness goals and objectives, then used to make data-driven decisions at various levels of the program. There are eight COR Advantage content areas that inform this data: Approaches to Learning, Social and Emotional Development, Physical Development and Health, Language, Literacy and Communication, Mathematics, Creative Arts, Science and Technology, and Social Studies. The chart shows how many of our 29 Head Start (Pre-K) students are below, meeting, or above the standard in each content area.
